Course Description:

This collaborative teaching program helps prepare secondary students for careers in education and training, through an immersive classroom experience. Pathways for Teaching focuses on general theory and practice of teaching and learning, the principles of educational psychology, the planning and implementation of educational activities, and school safety and health. The course combines a focus on teaching methods with time spent in the classroom working directly with students. Students also have the opportunity to interact with education professionals and participate in student education organizations and competitions.

Course Rationale:

Educators are in high demand across public education, as well as in corporate training settings. This course provides students interested in teaching and training the opportunity to get a jump-start on career preparation.

Course Objectives:

- The student will analyze the teaching profession through the lenses of personal characteristics, abilities, knowledge, and skills needed to work in education.
