COURSE RATIONALE

French IV students embrace the goal of life-long language proficiency and cultural competency. To be competitive in today's world, second language skills are invaluable. The communication skills attained in the study of a foreign language are essential for greater career opportunities, the development of empathy and cultural awareness, and personal growth on the path to global and ethical citizenship. Students in Level IV have the opportunity to earn dual credit and take national exams.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

French IV is a communicative and proficiency based study of language. Students will use relevant cultural themes to connect language learning and model global citizenship. Students will demonstrate their abilities in communicating about the

world around them in various tenses. Through active communication across the three modes (interpersonal, presentational, interpretive), students will participate in conversational exchanges, demonstrate knowledge, and support their opinions using sophisticated vocabulary and structures. Students will produce written communications and read authentic texts which reflect a deeper understanding of the language and cultural perspectives. French is the primary language of communication for this class. Students in French IV may have the opportunity to earn dual college credit. Students must meet the overall GPA eligibility requirement, and fees for dual credit will be paid by the student.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- The student will understand the main idea and key information in texts. (A+Reading, A+ Writing)
- The student will identify the main idea and key information in short straightforward conversations. (A+ Speaking and Listening)
- The student will exchange information in conversations on familiar topics and some researched topics, creating sentences and series of sentences and follow-up questions.
- The student will interact with others to meet their needs in a variety of familiar situations, creating sentences and series of sentences and follow-up questions.
- The student will exchange preferences, feelings, or opinions and provide basic advice on a variety of familiar topics, creating a series of connected sentences and follow-up questions.
- The student will state their viewpoint about familiar topics such as personal life, activities, events and other social experiences and give some reasons to support it, using connected sentences.
- The student will give straightforward presentations on familiar and researched topics, using connected sentences.
- The student will research and compare products and practices related to everyday life and personal interests or studies with respect to their own and other cultures. (A+ Research)
